Unit 4 - The New Testament

Worship Lesson - Jesus Came So We Can Know God

Scripture text - John 1:1-14

Key Idea - *God wants a relationship with us!*

Memorization Challenge

We're working toward memorizing the books of the Bible.

Series Scripture Memorization - 2 Timothy 3:16-17

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

The New Testament Scripture Memorization - Hebrews 4:12

For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword. It penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow. It judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

Family Faith Sharing

Bible text for this week is John 1:1-14

Suggested questions to consider whenever you read God's Word:

- What is something that caught your attention from this text?
- What questions did you have? Was there anything that bothered you?
- What did you learn about God? What did you learn about people/you?
- What is the Holy Spirit saying to you in these Scriptures?

TABLE TALK - Use these questions to start a discussion at meal times, while driving in the car, or just about anywhere.

Preschool & Early Elementary

- Why did Jesus come into our world?
- Imagine Jesus when he was your age; in what ways was Jesus just like you? In what ways can you be more like Jesus?

Older Elementary

- What difference does it make that the Word (Jesus) became a human being just like us?
- In what ways did Jesus experience life just like you do? In what ways can you be more like Jesus?

LIVING FAITH - Activities to help you engage with the Bible text.

Preschool & Early Elementary

- ♦ God created in the beginning and the Word (Christ) was with God in the beginning. Have a family member collect various odds and ends and place them all in a bag. Then as a family, use the items in the bag to create something together. Talk about how your creativity is like God's. In what ways is God's ability to create different from yours? Give God thanks for his gift of creativity in you.

Older Elementary

- ♦ Remember what you were like (or ask a parent/older sibling to share what you were like), as a baby or toddler, a preschooler, and early elementary age. Compare what you think Jesus was like at those same ages. Get creative with a way to represent these ideas. Draw pictures, make a skit and act it out (people or toy figures), make a video, or write it as a story.

Any Age

- ♦ Go on a nature walk. Give God praise for his wonderful creation.
- ♦ Discuss as a family one Jesus-like attitude or behavior you want to put into practice during this season of Lent. Decide on practical ways you can do this and ways you will hold each other accountable. Celebrate the ways you are growing to become more like Jesus.
